Our Speakers



Deborah Gray, Assistant Clinical Director - Special Care Dentistry, Greater Glasgow & Clyde

Chair: Prof R Munro

Deborah qualified as a dentist in 2012. She has worked in general practice, community dental services and hospital dental services. She became a specialist in Special Care Dentistry in 2019. She currently works within the Public Dental Service for GG&C as the Assistant Clinic Director for Special Care Dentistry.



Prof Stuart Ralston, University of Edinburgh

Stuart H Ralston graduated in Medicine from Glasgow University in 1978 and underwent higher medical training in General Internal Medicine and Rheumatology. He previously held the chair of Medicine and Bone Metabolism at the University of Aberdeen and moved to Edinburgh University in 2005 where he now holds the Arthritis Research UK Chair of Rheumatology. He is currently director of Edinburgh University's online distance learning MSc in

clinical trials and was director of Edinburgh Clinical Trials Unit between 2009 and 2016. He holds an

honorary consultant rheumatologist position with NHS Lothian where he is clinical lead for the osteoporosis service and clinical director of the rheumatology service. Professor Ralston has researched widely on the molecular and genetic basis of osteoporosis and other bone and joint diseases. He has a special interest in the pathogenesis and management of Paget's disease of bone. He is joint editor-in-chief of Calcified Tissue International and an editor of Davidson's Principles and Practice of Medicine. He was chair of the SIGN 142 guideline group on the Management of Osteoporosis and Prevention of Fragility Fractures in 2015 and 2021 and chairs one of the working groups of the Osteoporosis and Bone Research Academy for the Royal Osteoporosis Society. He was chair of the Commission for Human Medicines (CHM) for the Medicines and Healthcare Regulatory Authority (MHRA) between 2013 and 2021 during which time the CHM advised that the Pfizer/BioNtech, Moderna and AstraZeneca vaccines should be approved for emergency use in the UK.

The Brittle Bone Society is the sole organisation set up to address the needs of people born with Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI). The charity supports people in the UK and Republic of Ireland. It was the first registered charity in the world set up to support individuals with OI.



Patricia Osborne

Patricia has been CEO since 2009 working previously in the media, politics, and sport. 4 years as an Elected Member and as Chairperson for a National Sports Governing Body. Patricia worked on three successful strategic plans for the BBS. Patricia's focus has been on establishing the best support possible for the OI community, the set up of the charity's Medical & Scientific Advisory Boards, and membership of (AMRC) with non-commercial status /

NIHR. A current aim is to improve adult health care for rare bone by involvement with the new NHS Rare Disease Collaborative Network (RDCN)

Dr Mostafa Ahmad, Consultant Rheumatologist, NHS Fife

Dr. Mostafa Ahmad is a Consultant Rheumatologist at NHS Fife. He graduated from Assiut University in Egypt, where he earned an MSc in Internal Medicine. After relocating to the UK, Dr. Ahmad completed his specialty training in Rheumatology and General Internal Medicine (GIM) in Edinburgh. Passionate about medical education, he designed and continues to lead the Rheumatology module for the University of Edinburgh's online MSc programme in Internal Medicine. He is also an

Associate Fellow of the Higher Education Academy (AFHEA). Currently, Dr. Ahmad is a member of the British Society for Rheumatology's (BSR) working group, contributing to the update of biologic DMARDs safety guidelines. His clinical interests include macrophage activation syndrome and musculoskeletal ultrasound.



Professor Stefan Siebert, Inflammation Medicine & Rheumatology, University of Glasgow, NHS GG&C

Professor of Inflammation Medicine and Rheumatology in the University of Glasgow and honorary Consultant Rheumatologist in NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde where he runs specialist psoriatic arthritis (PsA) and combined dermatology-gastroenterology-rheumatology clinics. He leads the PsA and inflammatory arthritis clinical research programme in Glasgow. Research activities include disease pathogenesis, biomarker discovery, comorbidities, routine-data linkage and running observational cohort, experimental

medicine and interventional studies. He has published widely in peer-reviewed journals. He is the current co-lead for the ongoing EULAR Task Force for the definition of difficult-to-treat PsA. He is also the Deputy Chair of the UK NIHR Musculoskeletal TRC and co-director of the Glasgow Centre of Excellence for Trials Collaboration (CETC), member of GRAPPA (previous member of the GRAPPA global steering committee) and ASAS.



Professor David Hunt, Consultant Neurologist, University of Edinburgh/NHS Lothian

Professor David Hunt is a Wellcome Trust Senior Clinical Fellow and Consultant Neurologist who leads clinics and research in the field of brain inflammation and multiple sclerosis. He undertook medical and neurology training in London and Switzerland. As Head of Neuroinflammatory Medicine, David leads NHS multiple sclerosis and neuroinflammation services in Edinburgh and directs related research at the Anne Rowling Clinic. David has

developed specialised clinics for people affected by rare neuroinflammatory disorders, including joint neurovasculitis clinics.



Dr Alexis Jones, Consultant Rheumatologist, UCLH

Dr Alexis Jones is a Consultant Rheumatologist at University College London Hospital (UCLH). Her interests include hyperinflammatory syndromes, acute inpatient rheumatology, spondyloarthritis, MSK imaging, teaching and training. Dr Alexis Jones runs the HLH service with Dr Jessica Manson, Consultant Rheumatologist at UCLH. In 2024, the service combined with the HLH service at Sheffield Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, won the British Society for Rheumatology Best

Practice Award and Patient Choice Award. Dr Alexis Jones has published a number of papers on HLH and was part of the task force in the Getting It Right First Time (GIRFT) pathway and guidance for diagnosis, treatment and management of HLH as well as the HiHASC guidelines on the diagnosis and investigation of HLH. Dr Alexis Jones completed her MD (Res) on quantitative imaging in axial spondyloarthritis. She has a keen interest in teaching and training and is the Post Graduate Medical Education lead for rheumatology at UCLH.



Dr Oseme Etomi, Consultant Obstetric Physician and Rheumatologist, Guys and St Thomas' Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust

Dr Oseme Etomi is a Consultant Rheumatologist and Obstetric Physician in South East London and works across 2 NHS trusts including Guy's and St Thomas' Hospital and the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Woolwich. Within Rheumatology, she looks after patients with SLE predominantly. Within the field of Obstetric Medicine, her main interest is looking after women with inflammatory diseases and immunosuppression in pregnancy. She runs a weekly inflammatory rheumatic disease and a weekly inflammatory bowel disease clinic in pregnancy. Oseme has published abstracts and papers on Inflammatory

Rheumatic Disease in pregnancy. In 2018 she was awarded the best oral presentation at the international Society of Obstetric Medicine for her work in this field. She was also instrumental in setting up the British Society of Rheumatology Specialist interest group in Pregnancy in 2019. She sits on the advisory board for the Biologics in Rheumatoid arthritis Pregnancy (BiRAP) group and was one of the organisers of the highly successful 12th Rheumapreg Symposium in September 2023 in London.

Her other interests include work on diversity, inclusion and wellbeing. She is the lead for trainee wellbeing in O&G at GSTT.



Dr Lesley Kay, Consultant Rheumatologist, Newcastle upon Tyne Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust

Dr Kay is a Consultant Rheumatologist in Newcastle upon Tyne, vice chair of the Northern Clinical Senate Council and a trustee of the National Axial Spondyloarthritis Society. She was previously acting medical director and deputy medical director at the Healthcare Safety Investigation Branch (HSIB), clinical director for musculoskeletal services and for patient safety and quality in her trust, and chair of the British Society for Rheumatology's clinical affairs committee. She has a masters' degrees in public health and in leadership and quality improvement.



Dr Hazem Youssef, Consultant Rheumatologist, NHS Grampian, Senior Lecturer at the University of Aberdeen

Hazem is also national TPD for Rheumatology in Scotland Deanery and President Elect of SSR with a particular interest in quality improvement & risk management.
